'A mighty oak from a little acorn grows'. A pioneering initiative by the founding members has seen a small school grow and flourish to an institute with linkages in Kolkata and districts in West Bengal, to states across India and reach international shores. A journey that spans fifty eventful years of overcoming challenges to achieve successful milestones in the disability sector.

Along with meeting departmental targets, several events to promote organisational awareness and showcase the talents of beneficiaries were held all through the year. We remain grateful to all those who have reposed faith and generously supported us. 'Transformative Learning' a collaborative workshop focused on inclusive learning environments. 2024 ended with the launch of book IICP's 50 year publication, 'Over the Rainbow' by Shri Gopalkrishna Gandhi, former Governor, West Bengal. It is a testament to resilience and honours the people and milestones of a journey that began in 1974.



SERVICES 2024-25

FAMILY SERVICES

In 2024-25 this service was supported by Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers Ltd and Century Ply (India) Ltd

A multi-disciplinary team of physiotherapists, special educators, occupational therapists and social workers in the Early Intervention Clinic and Family Services work with parents and primary caregivers for the effective management of their child with disability, aiming to facilitate overall development.

 39 children were provided with customized, adaptive furniture and leg gaiters for support.

- 142 new children attended the weekly diagnostic clinics.
- 23 children were recommended for admission to School Services after assessment.
- Service users availed of hydrotherapy supervised by trained physiotherapists and occupational therapists.









SCHOOL SERVICES

JUGNU Sishu Vihar Kendra

In 2024-25 this was supported by ECE Industries, Indegene Limited and Soumitro Sen. We thank DLF Foundation for current support.

A playschool and nutrition programme for underprivileged children from the neighbourhood runs in the premises of the Centre for Special Education. The students are divided into two groups according to their age, ability and needs. Activities include early learning skills, art and craft, music and games with an emphasis on health and hygiene. All services including nutritious snacks and a health check-up are provided free of cost. This year outings included a Christmas party at the Calcutta Cricket and Football Club and the Shishu Mela at St Xavier's College, Kolkata.

- 81 children aged between 2 plus and 6 years were enrolled during the year.
- 12 children participated in the drawing competition for the Shoky Awards.
- 45 mothers were guided on better health, hygiene and nutrition for their children.



Centre for Special Education (CSE)

In 2024-25 CSE was supported by Garden Reach Shipbuilders & Engineers Ltd, TM International Logistics Ltd, Vesuvius India Ltd, MK Hamied Foundation, Mangal Steel Enterprises Pvt Ltd, Linde India Ltd., National Indian Association of Women. The Manindra Nath and Aparna Ganguli Memorial Class was supported by Dipak Kumar Banerjee.

The school provides a wide-ranging curriculum to meet the diverse educational needs of 148 beneficiaries along with physiotherapy, speech therapy, hydrotherapy, augmentative and alternative communication and advocacy training. Students participate in a range of programmes and varied co-curricular activities. During the year these included –

- Planting of saplings on Earth Day at Sushila Birla Girls' School
- IICP's inclusive Annual Concert at Rabindra Sadan
- The Himalayan Nature and Adventure Camp in North Bengal
- Musical performances at the Hope Concert and River Festival
- Participation in the Buddy Marathon
- A visit to the Kolkata Book Fair 2025



Open School Unit (OSU)

In 2024-25 the OSU was supported by the Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiatives and Soroptimist International, Calcutta.

The Inclusive Open School enrols adults from a wide spectrum of society for the Secondary course of the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) and The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling or State Open School (SOS). NIOS acknowledges IICP as a SAIED centre (Special Accredited Institutions for Education of Divyangs) meant for students with a Disability Certificate. Students attend Media lab, computer and advocacy classes. They participate in different events and attend celebration of festivals and special occasions.

- 33 candidates appeared for the Secondary Examination under The West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling in June and December 2024.
- 5 students attended online weekend classes for Physics and Mathematics (STEM Education) conducted by volunteer Utsav Gupta, student of Tanglin Trust School, Singapore.





ADULT SERVICES

Vocational Training Centre

In 2024-25 this service was supported by Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiatives

80 adults, both with disabilities and from low socio-economic families, receive skill-development training with an emphasis on employment and sustainable livelihoods. Modular courses in printing, catering and computer applications are offered along with advocacy and social skills. Efforts are made to find meaningful employment through participation in Rozgar Mela, a job fair organised by the State Government. Trainees attended interviews with agencies like Arambagh Foods, Sarthak Educational Trust, KFC and National Carrier Service.

- 42 students received training in block printing, spiral binding, making of paper bags and folders.
- 19 trainees completed modular courses in bakery, confectionery, snacks and beverages.
- Paper products, snacks and confectionery were sold at the German Consulate Christmas Bazar, Nobel Mission Carnival and Care-Nival 2.0.
- 87 pounds of Christmas cake were baked and sold on order.
- Orders for 765 paper bags were completed for She Kantha, CIMA Art Gallery and KA Women Entrepreneurs Association.
- 19 new students enrolled for basic and advanced courses in computer applications.
- 10 external learners of the Open School Unit attended Personal Contact Program (PCP) classes & mock tests for their computer exam.











ADULT DAY CENTRE (ADC)

In 2024-25 this service was supported by Century Ply Boards India Ltd, Soroptimist International Kolkata, Puja Paul, Neelam and Madan Lal.

A leisure and learning centre that provides a range of activities including occupational skills for 67 adults with severe to profound disabilities and high support needs. A varied range of recreational activities and leisure skills are provided.

- Two adults participated in the Buddy Marathon organised for persons with special needs.
- Barsha Bhattacharya, attended "Breaking Barriers", the special Book Fair for specially abled authors, at the Press Club.
- Putul Biswas, Rakshit Khare and Barsha Bhattacharya participated in a collaborative art workshop in colaboration with Inuiti Foundation, facilitated by the Stockholm University.
- Sudhangshu Das attended a 7 day Nature Camp organized by the Himalayan Nature Adventure Foundation in Kalimpong district.





RESIDENTIAL SERVICES

In 2024-25 the service was supported by MK Hamied Foundation

IICP offers respite for parents and guardians to leave their wards in a secure environment in times of need. It is managed by a team of committed professionals and caregivers with utmost priority placed on safety, hygiene and personal choice. Adults with disabilities are given training in skills.

- 5 adults have been enrolled for Long Term Residential Service for lifelong care.
- 43 adults used the service for short stays.
- 42 adults attended the summer and winter holiday camps.







INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

IN 2024-25 this service was supported by Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiatives

The department offers short vocational courses in basic and advanced computer applications for employability and empowerment. It provides technological support and solutions across all services for projects, programmes and training courses. Along with the modular courses, trainees attend Communicative English classes to enhance their language skills. The qualified and eligible trainees are assisted for placements and internships.

- 12 trainees are enrolled for Communicative English class
- 7 trainees successfully completed the course on Computer Basics and Office Assistance





ROSHNI, National Resource Centre for Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC)

'Roshni', provides customized services and training to AAC users, families and professionals working in the field. This includes development and demonstration of lo-tech and hi-tech resources and methods. **Building Bridges**' is an initiative that supports students in mainstream schools with complex communication needs. It coordinates the activities of the **Media Lab**, a creative space for adults using AAC to discuss and debate on topics of relevance through text, art, music, films, imagery and design. Deep Dolui, Aniket Mukherjee and Mumpy Singh attended an online art workshop, a part of a research project in collaboration with Inuiti Foundation and Stockholm University.

The **Writer's Workshop** sessions enhance language competencies for students using AAC.

- The Pen Pals program fostered bonds of friendship between 7 students of the academic unit of CSE and South Point School.
- Members of the Media Lab, especially Mukul Vyas, discovered new skills of graphic design using Canva software.







GENERIC SERVICES

Social Services

Trained social work professionals provide support to children and adults with disabilities across all departments. The team conduct counselling sessions, provide support to families in times of crises, supervise placements and internships and provide orientation to visitors. They support the panel of doctors who give advice to parents and maintain contact with individual sponsors.

- 26 home visits were conducted for family counselling and crisis intervention
- 47 families received anti epilepsy medicines, free of cost
- 44 beneficiaries were provided with special aids and appliances
- 41 beneficiaries were assisted to procure their Disability certificates





Therapy

Physiotherapists and occupational therapists work on the physical and functional abilities of children and adults with an emphasis on posture and seating. The department coordinates hydrotherapy, an integral aspect of therapeutic management and afternoon clinics for sensory integration. Therapists conduct training at all levels and supervise interns. Sessions in the hydrotherapy pool improve muscle strength and range of motion for beneficiaries.

- 30 wheelchairs were purchased with donations from Nicco Engineering Services Ltd, Parcon India Pvt Ltd and Talbros Automotive Components Ltd.
- 10 wheelchairs were donated by a member of **Soroptimist International**, **Calcutta**.
- 338 students from all departments attended hydrotherapy sessions supervised by trained therapists.
- 109 persons with disabilities received intervention at community projects in Basanti and Noorpur.
- 13 beneficiaries received special furniture, gaiters and AFO's.









ANKUR ADVOCACY GROUP (AAG)

The mission of the Ankur Advocacy Group is to change public perceptions about persons with disabilities through awareness programs and right based campaigns in mainstream schools, colleges and street corners. It focuses on discussing transformative solutions for an accessible and inclusive society.

- Smt Aditi Chaudhary, IAS, State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities visited IICP.
- Meetings were held with Election Commission officials and the State Commissioner for Persons with Disability to facilitate access to the electoral booths.
- Awareness programs in collaboration with the Kolkata Police and Kolkata Municipal Corporation were held in 7 municipal wards.
- Sudipendu Dutta, was nominated as the PwD Voter Icon by the District Election Office, Kolkata (South).
- Sensitization and orientation programmes were conducted through the year for students from hospitals, nursing colleges and educational institutions.





COMMUNITY BASED SERVICES

In 2024-25 these services were supported by Dipak Kumar Banerjee and Talbros Automotive Components

Outreach services for persons with disabilities and training for capacity building is carried out in rural areas and urban slums in partnership with local organisations. A rural project in the Basanti block (Sundarbans) covers 13 villages. Services comprise assessments, intervention through home visits by field workers, resource centre based services and referrals. IICP professionals conducted a training programme for 4 community health and field workers of Rangabelia Mahila Industrial Co-operative Society, Gosaba

- 85 children and 63 adults were assessed by IICP professionals at the resource centre in Basanti
- Enrolment of Unique Disability ID (UDID) cards was completed for 95 individuals; 35 have already received their card
- 12 persons with disability now receive a monthly pension under the Manabik Pension Scheme







COMMUNICATION AND FUND RAISING

It has always been a priority to acknowledge with gratitude all those who support the organisation that enable us to translate many dreams into reality. IICP's services, training programs and projects are supported by donors, sponsors, individuals, corporates and organizations. We thank them all for their caring and committed support.

The 50 year Friendship Wall in our auditorium, acknowledges in grateful appreciation the contributions made during the milestone year, including all those who supported the Hope Concert, a fund raising initiative with mesmerizing music by Babul Supriyo, and Soumitra Ray of 'Bhoomi'.

We remain indebted to **Ananda Publishers and the ABP Group** who have generously been the media partner for the Hope Concert and printed the 50th year commemorative book '**Over the Rainbow**'. They have, for many years, unstintingly supported the publication of IICP's Annual Report and Deepshikha, its annual magazine.

Efforts to raise funds through the sale of greeting cards and products made by IICP continued all year round.

The 14th Hope Cup golf tournament was held on 24-25 January 2025 in collaboration with the Tollygunge Club. ADMINISTRATION AND ACCOUNTS



The department provided support for all the medical camps, visits and special events held during the 50th year and ensured these were conducted in a seamless manner. Renewals of relevant licences and maintenance contracts were done along with safety audits of all vehicles. A refresher training in fire fighting was conducted for staff of IICP by the Fire Service Station, Behala. The total solar units produced from April 2024 to March 2025 were 28,365 of which units utilized by CESC were valued at Rs 47895/-. This was effective in cutting costs.



Success Stories





Two year old **Angshuman Acharya** came to IICP a year ago. Diagnosed with hydrocephalus, he was unable to sit, showed little interest in his surroundings and cried most of the time. Initially, it was a struggle during sessions of physiotherapy and sensory integration but gradually he began to cooperate, respond to his name, and engage in activities. He now recognizes familiar faces, enjoys action rhymes and eagerly reaches for the xylophone. His mother now feeds him seated in a chair, follows structured routines at home and is happy with his steady progress.

11 year old **Piu Halder**, a bright and friendly girl with cerebral palsy is a wheelchair user. She was first brought by her grandmother to the Family Services in 2019. Piu made good progress and is currently a student in Junior Academics II. Concessions in fees, special furniture for supported seating at home and anti- epilepsy medicine free of cost enabled Piu's family to continue with her education.

A responsible and diligent student, Piu also takes enthusiastic part in all cultural programmes and co-curricular activities. She excels at elocution, art and wheelchair dancing. Spending a week at the Himalayan Nature and Adventure camp last December was a high point for her.





Debangshu Ray, diagnosed with cerebral palsy is a student of Junior Academy II. He has excellent comprehension and communication skills. He uses the Spell Board to answer questions from theme based topics. He demonstrates remarkable adaptability in using a switch to operate the computer for writing. He has put considerable effort in preparing for his OBE-Level A examinations in all four subjects. Apart from academics, Debangshu enjoys music session and creative writing. He was nominated Student of the Year 2024, an award instituted by the Banerjee family.

When she first joined the school two years ago, eight year old **Aarohi Shaw** with right side hemiparesis had slurred speech. She spoke very little and her cognitive skills were limited to picture recognition. She attended speech therapy sessions which gradually made a great difference to her communication skills. With patience and encouragement from her teachers, Aarohi's interactions with her peers improved. She made good progress in numeracy and identification of English and Hindi alphabets. Regular physiotherapy improved her mobility and gradually she was able to walk unaided but under supervision. When her father was transferred out of Kolkata, Aarohi sat for a test and was admitted in Kendriya Vidyalaya, a mainstream school.







Punam Bind is a multifaceted young lady. Enrolled in class XII, under the National Institute of Open Schooling Board, she has successfully passed three of her subjects. Her eloquent Hindi oration is appreciated by the audience be it at stage events, street campaigns or awareness programs. At the Bengal Chamber of Commerce, she advocated for social acceptance and employment of persons with disabilities, in the corporate sector.

Punam participates in cultural programs with enthusiasm and was selected to attend a three week residency program in New Delhi for a collaborative project between Tanzbar Bremen Germany, Goethe Institute, Pickle Factory Dance Foundation and IICP. The performances in New Delhi and Kolkata highlighted accessibility and inclusivity within contemporary dance through innovative movement and expressions.

19-year-old **Deep Dolui** has cerebral palsy and uses a wheelchair. A mature, hardworking, young adult he is currently enrolled in the Open School unit to complete his class X under the NIOS Board. Deep has made every effort to achieve knowledge and skills. He has done well in academics and is keen to continue higher studies. A percussionist with the IICP music band, he has received acclaim for his performances in IICP and at cultural events held outside the institute. He is a good orator and has participated at advocacy awareness programs and stage performances. Deep has received awards for his skills in art. He exemplifies the phrase where there is a will, there is a way.





Jui Sardar is a mature, soft spoken young lady and a wheelchair user. Jui has successfully cleared the Secondary Examination through the NIOS Board. She has completed various modular courses in computer literacy. She excels in singing and has performed at various platforms. As the lead singer of IICP's band, she felt privileged to perform with singing icon Usha Uthup during IICP's 50th anniversary celebrations. A disability rights advocate, Jui is a member of the Ankur Advocacy Group and takes active part in awareness programmes. Despite various adversities, Jui strives for economic independence and manages to contribute to the family income. With her mother, she operates a roadside kiosk that sells packaged snacks and items of daily use. She was nominated Trainee of the Year 2024, an award instituted by the Banerjee family.

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Indian Institute of Cerebral Palsy, which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2025, and the Income and Expenditure Account, Receipt and Payment Account for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Institute as at March 31, 2025, and of its financial performance for the year then ended in accordance with the generally accepted Accounting Principles applicable in India.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) issued by ICAI. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for* the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the entity in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in India and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Responsibilities of Management and those Charged with Governance for the Financial **Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the aforesaid Accounting Policies and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

preparing the financial statements. management is responsible for assessing the entity's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the entity or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so. 



SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICY AND NOTES ON ACCOUNTS

A. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- 1. The fixed assets are valued at historical costs.
- 2. The Depreciation on fixed assets are provided on the written down value method at rates as prescribed by the income Tax Act, 1961.
- 3. Stock of Greeting Cards & Merchandise Items are valued at cost.
- 4. Income from Tea, Catering & Printing Unit netted off in Income & Expenditure Account.
- 5. Income Recognition:
 - (i) Donations towards Class Sponsorships are treated on accrual basis. All other donations and grants are recognised when received;
 - (ii) Interest on fixed deposits is recognised on accrual basis with reference to the interest certificates provided by banks and Form 26AS of the Income Tax Rules, and
 - (iii) All other items of income are recognised on cash basis.
- 6. Employees' Benefit:
 - (i) Employees Gratuity Fund maintained with Life Insurance Corporation of India.
 - (ii) Employees Provident Fund maintained with the Commissioner of Provident Fund.
 - (iii) Employees E.S.I.C. benefit is maintained with the Directorate of E.S.I.C.
- 7. Donations are recognised in the Corpus Fund only where the donor has communicated in writing that it is making the donation towards the corpus. All other donations are treated as revenue donations.
- 8. Stock of Tea is valued at cost or net realisable value, whichever is lower


